#### CITY OF WACO FILM PERMITTING PROCESS

- A film permit is required when filming involves City of Waco services, such as street closures.
- Filming on private property does not require a permit. Please notify us when you'll be filming, regardless of whether a permit is required.
- \$35 permit fee.
- Insurance is required.
- coordinate with other City departments on City services, such as street closures, security, etc.

 Two forms to complete and sign. • City of Waco Parks and Recreation staff will review the permit, process any fees, and • Waco Film Commission staff will assist you at any time needed during the process.
