Armstrong Browning Library

Allow one (1) hour to tour, 15 mins driving and loading . 710 Speight Ave.

This free library on the Baylor University campus is dedicated to the works of Victorian poets Robert and Elizabeth Barrett Browning, housing many of their writings and personal effects, including furnishings, paintings and an extensive Wedgwood collection. The library is home to the largest collection of secular stained glass in the world. An unexpected treasure!



Martin Museum of Art

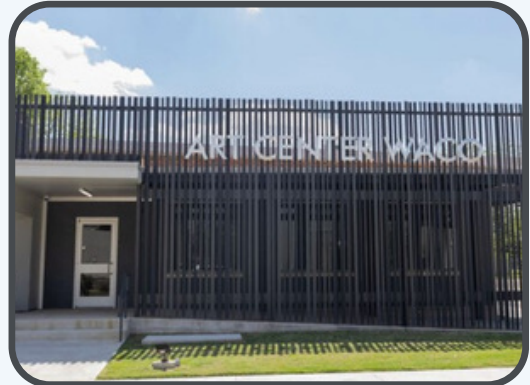
Allow 45 mins to tour, 15 mins driving and loading 60 Baylor Ave.

Allow 45 mins to tour, 15 mins driving and loading 701 S. 8th Street

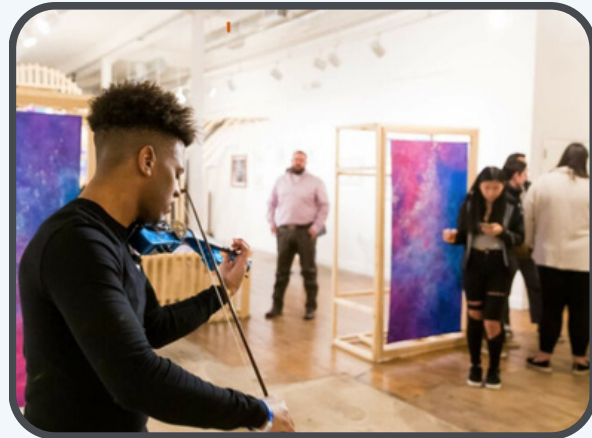
ACW is a curator and presenter of exhibitions both at the Center and in a mobile gallery. Check the website to see what treasures await!

This community-run gallery offers events galore. Be sure to check out the studio spaces upstairs and the underground speakeasy.

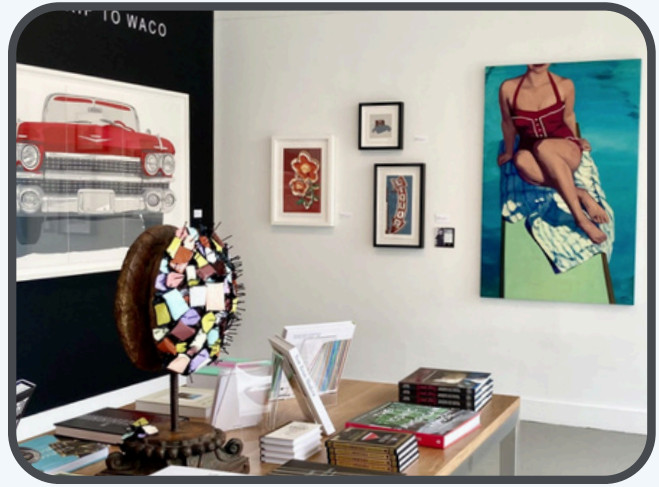

The grandiose Karem Shrine Temple was dedicated in 1928 as a freemason-affiliated space. Joanna and Chip and Gaines acquired the structure and rededicated the space as a hotel in the Fall of 2023. Be sure to check out the library and a collection previously owned by Larry McMurtry.

Waco Suspension Bridge

**Allow 30 mins to tour, 10 mins driving and loading
