# The Earle-Harrison House and Pape Gardens

Allow 1 hour to tour, 15 mins driving and loading 1901 N. 5th Street

**P**rized for the beauty of its botanical garden and grounds, as much for the antebellum house itself, visitors to this Greek-Revival mansion are wowed by towering oaks, a lily pond, and a huge rose arbor.





#### **Cameron Park Zoo**

Allow 2 hours or more to tour 1701 N. 4th

Endangered African penguins are our new celebrity crush at the beautiful Cameron Park zoo. The penguins and other creatures who call this award-winning, natural habitat zoo home not only live here, but flourish.



#### **Waco Mammoth National Monument**

Allow 45 mins to tour, 20 mins driving and loading 6220 Steinbeck Bend

"The nation's first and only recorded discovery of a nursery herd of Pleistocene mammoths." -National Park Service.

This fascinating find is still an active dig site! Ask about Jr. Ranger program, or add on fun like the Big Dig, Mighty Molars or Fossil Fun programs.

## Lake Waco Wetlands

Allow 1.5 hour to tour, 30 mins driving and loading 1752 Eichelberger Crossing Road. 76633

A favored place among birdwatchers, this peaceful habitat is home to aquatic plants, reptiles, mammals, amphibians and some 185 species of migratory birds.

# Carleen Bright Arboretum

Allow 1.5 hour to tour, 20 mins driving and loading 9001 Bosque Blvd.
