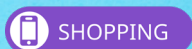

Welcome to WACO

Conveniently located on I-35 in the center of the state, just 90 miles from Dallas and Austin, Waco has long been known as the "Heart of Texas." Named after the Waco Indian tribe, the village of Waco was established in 1849 and incorporated in 1856. The legendary Chisholm and Shawnee cattle trails both crossed Waco's historic Suspension Bridge on their way to northern cattle markets.



Today, Waco is a diverse city of 147,434, with a university, two colleges, over 40 hotels and 300+ restaurants. We are home to the famous Magnolia Market, owned by Chip and Joanna Gaines.

Waco is also the home of a lively cultural district. Discover open-air festivals and concerts by the river, sports events, a popular Saturday morning farmers market, a vibrant downtown, theatre, live music, and a thriving arts scene, just to name a few!

Waco's ATTRACTIONS & MUSEUMS

CAMERON PARK ZOO

The Cameron Park Zoo rests on 52 acres adjacent to the Brazos River. Lush native vegetation, splashing waterfalls, a picturesque lake and ponds surround the different natural habitats that are home to giraffes, lions, capybaras and an African elephant. The Asian Forest features the critically-endangered orangutans, Sumatran tigers, and a Komodo dragon. Other residents include gibbons, lemurs, Galapagos tortoises and the Brazos River Country's variety of North American animals. Enjoy a 50,000-gallon coral reef saltwater aquarium and the playful river otters as they swim around the children who slide through the otter exhibit. Be sure to stop by and see the new Penguin Shores exhibit, featuring South African black-footed penguins!

MAYBORN MUSEUM COMPLEX

The Mayborn Museum Complex, on the campus of Baylor University, brings together the resources of hands-on discovery rooms and interactive natural science and cultural history galleries. This rich combination provides a wide spectrum of engaging learning opportunities for visitors of all ages. The complex also includes the Gov. Bill & Vara Daniel Historic Village, depicting life in Texas from the late 1800's to the early 20th century, a theater and gift shop. Traveling exhibits vary throughout the year in the Special Exhibits Hall.

WACO MAMMOTH NATIONAL MONUMENT

In July 2015, this site was declared a National Monument due to its historical significance. This paleontological site represents the nation's only recorded discovery of a nursery herd of Columbian mammoths. Visitors can view "in situ" fossils including female mammoths, a bull mammoth, and a camel that lived approximately 67,000 years ago.

Homestead Craft Village, located 5 miles outside Waco, offers shopping, dining, and self-guided tours. The 18-acre complex includes a 200-year old barn, the Potter's House, a woodworking shop, a restored 1760 gristmill, fiber arts, herb garden, and more. Guided tours are available by appointment. Café Homestead, serving natural beef and homemade baked goods, is one of the top-rated restaurants in the Waco area. TEXAS RANGER HALL OF FAME & MUSEUM

The Texas Ranger Hall of Fame & Museum is the official State Hall of Fame and Museum for the Texas Rangers. History buffs, gun collectors and those enchanted by the Wild West and Ranger lore will love it here. The museum's 14,000 artifacts date back to the early days of Texas, and include badges, firearms, tack, and personal gear. Displays include a Bonnie & Clyde exhibit, and memorabilia from *The Lone Ranger* and *Walker, Texas Ranger*. The Hall of Fame commemorates 30 brave Rangers who died in service and served with distinction.

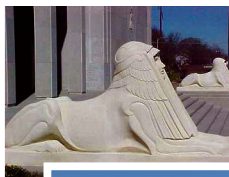

Waco's POINTS OF INTEREST

DORIS MILLER MEMORIAL

Doris Miller was born and raised in the Waco area, and was awarded the Navy Cross for bravery after Pearl Harbor. He was the first Black American to receive the honor, given to sailors and marines for heroism during combat. Serving as a messman on the USS West Virginia, Doris Miller helped pull the ship's mortally wounded captain to safety.

Untrained in the use of heavy artillery, Doris then fired at the attacking planes. The memorial includes a stylized sculpture of the USS West Virginia and a sculpture of the hero.

RIVERWALK AND SCULPTURE ZOO

The Riverwalk is found on both sides of the Brazos River in downtown Waco. On the west side, the paved walk extends from Baylor University all the way to McLennan Community College, via Cameron Park. The Riverwalk trail within Cameron Park is not paved, while the rest of the trail is made of concrete and is ADA-accessible. The Riverwalk crosses the Brazos at the Herring Ave. Bridge and loops back along Martin Luther King, Jr. Blvd. to Franklin Ave. In early 2020, 28 zoo animal sculptures were added along the Riverwalk between Indian Spring Park and the entrance to the Cameron Park Zoo. Portions of the Riverwalk near I-35 may be inaccessible at times due to construction.

VIETNAM VETERANS MEMORIAL

Dedicated in 2004, this memorial honors all who served in Vietnam, including those missing in action, and memorializes those who lost their lives in the conflict. The Vietnam Veterans Memorial tells the story of the war and its effects on Waco and the nation. Pavilions in the sculpture walk include The Beginning, The Conflict, and The Honor. Under the third pavilion stands a monument listing the names of the fallen who were from McLennan County. Yaupon holly trees were planted for each fallen soldier.

Just past the Vietnam Veterans Memorial, the visitor can find memorials commemorating those lost in the Korean, Gulf, Iraq, and Afghanistan wars.

WACO SUSPENSION BRIDGE (1870)

Waco's Suspension Bridge is the oldest suspension bridge still in use in Texas. Built in 1870, it was the first bridge to span the mighty Brazos River. Cattle drives crossed the river using the bridge, following the course of the Chisholm Trail or Shawnee Trail. An official Chisholm Trail marker can be seen on the east side of the bridge. On the west side, in Indian Spring Park, the "Branding the Brazos" cattle drive sculpture group pays homage to Waco's role in the historic Texas cattle drives.

MAGNOLIA MARKET AT THE SILOS

Magnolia Market features two landmark 120' high silos, built in 1950 as part of the Brazos Valley Cotton Oil Company. The complex now includes a 12,000 square-foot market located inside the historic grain barn, a food truck park with picnic tables, a wiffle ball field, the Shops at the Silos (six rotating boutiques), the Silos Baking Co., Magnolia Press (coffee shop), Magnolia Home (home decor), Magnolia Seed & Supply, a restored historic church, and photo ops galore.

The Silos and all shops on the grounds are open **Monday - Saturday** (*closed Sundays*) from **9am - 6pm**. The only exception is Magnolia Press, which is open from **7am - 6pm**.

Waco's CULTURAL DIVERSITY

Named after the Huaco Native American tribe, the village of Waco was established in 1849 and incorporated as a city in 1856 by a Jewish, Jamaican-born Spaniard named Jacob de Cordova.

Today, Waco is a diverse, bustling city with a demographic makeup that is 43 percent white, 32 percent Latin American, 22 percent African American, and 2 percent Asian American.

Wacoans come from many backgrounds and differing cultures, religions, and identities. They celebrate and pay homage to their diversity collectively in a multitude of ways.

Waco's Latin history far predates the city. The land of Central Texas once belonged to the Spanish empire, and then Mexico, until Texas fought for its independence in 1836. After almost another decade of struggle, Texas joined the United States and started down the path to becoming the Latin-Anglo melting pot it is today. Before long, a Spanish immigrant by the name of Jacob de Cordova came to town and officially founded the city of Waco.



For more than a century, the Latin American population of Waco has had a tremendous impact on the growth and development of the city. During the Mexican Revolution, Waco's Sandtown neighborhood proved to be a haven for Latin immigrants and Latin Americans fleeing border violence. When Waco's red-light district, known as the Reservation, closed, an area flush with large houses near downtown suddenly became available, and Calle Dos, a thriving Latin American community, was born.

Waco's Latin American community continues to share its gifts and strengths with the larger Waco community through art, food, music, and houses of worship. Today, you can experience the

beauty of Waco's Latin American community throughout the city.

Black Americans have held a central role in the development of Waco and McLennan County since the first permanent settlements were established in the mid-nineteenth century. The first Black residents came to Central Texas primarily as slaves to white cotton farmers.

When the South lost the Civil War within 10 years of the city's incorporation, Black Americans worked to build new lives as freedmen and freedwomen. Within this work toward social and economic equality,



Black Americans shaped the history of local communities as they moved into the 20th century. Tenant farmers and sharecroppers produced the cash crop which brought prosperity to the city, and Black entrepreneurs opened businesses on Waco's Bridge Street. New institutions in the areas of education, finance, and ushered in a higher standard of living.

Texas is a thriving, multicultural state thanks in part to the perseverance and the presence of Asian Americans.

The first Asian immigrants to arrive in Texas in 1870 were Chinese laborers employed to build the Houston and Texas Central Railroad. Additional Chinese workers arrived in 1881 to follow the construction of the Southern Pacific Railroad. A Chinese exclusion law enacted by Congress the following year prevented any more Chinese from arriving in the states until 1943. Since that time, nearly 1.2 million Asian Americans have settled in Texas – the third-largest population hub in the United States. There are sizable communities in Austin, Dallas-Fort Worth, Houston, Killeen, and Port Arthur.
